HOAC Intend to undertake a phased re-opening of the Activity and Training Centre (see HOAC table above). HOAC plan a Phase 1 restricted re-opening on 9th June. From that date members may visit HOAC, maintain their boats and undertake recreational sailing only.

Initial opening times/slots will be:

- Tuesday - Friday 1pm to 3pm; 3.30pm to 5.30pm
- Saturday/Sunday 10am to 12pm,; 12.30pm to 2.30pm; 3pm to 5pm

Slots must be booked in advance and are limited. If you are using your own boat or a QSC boat, the time slot is an arrival time and once on site you may continue your activity as long as you wish until the centre closes.

This document should be read in conjunction with the HOAC public notice of re-opening and any subsequent updates. Please note that HOAC rules apply and members must comply with them and with any directions from HOAC staff.

Key areas for all members to consider and comply with for a safe return to sailing:

- **Government Rules and Guidance on COVID-19**
  - Be aware of and to comply with government guidance and instructions on COVID-19
- **HOAC Risk Assessments, guidance and instruction**
  - Read and comply with HOAC Risk Assessment, guidance and instruction on COVID-19 and how to make use of the HOAC facilities as safely as possible

- **Social Distancing**
  - Comply with Social Distancing rules and remain 2 meters from other non household members.
  - There are no changing or toilet facilities on site.
  - Sail single handed only or sail double handed with a member of their own household
  - Do not congregate in groups anywhere on site.
  - Launch and recover your boat single handed (double if in same household)
  - One boat on one ramp at a time. Consider using the ramps/slipway furthest from the log cabin to assist with social distancing.
  - A one way walking system has been introduced and you are required to follow HOAC directions.
  - Members will no longer sign themselves in but must make themselves known to the duty officer who will make a note
  - Entrance to members car park is via the motorised HOAC side gate and the car park is at the eastern (rear) end of the Boat park on grass.
  - Members will be required to show their HOAC membership card (new membership cards are being posted out by HOAC) and/or a booking confirmation to the security at the top of the lane. You are not required to open your window to show the card, show through the glass
- **Common Touch Points**
  - You must avoid contact with common touch points and other members' craft and equipment
  - Only touch your own launching trolley, Do not stack trolleys
  - Refreshments are NOT available and members are asked to leave the premises as soon as their activity is completed and their equipment is put away.
- **Boat and equipment hygiene**
  - Cold, damp and smooth surfaces are likely to prolong the life of the virus therefore boat washing facilities will be available for use at HOAC.
  - HOAC owned boats will be washed before and after use by HOAC Staff
  - QSC owned boats must be put back in their parking bays and left uncovered after use. They will be washed down and covered by the HOAC Staff after use. Please do not use a QSC boat that is uncovered as it will not have been disinfected - choose another one.
  - Privately owned boats are not required to be disinfected but owners may do so if they wish or if the boat is going to be used by another person,, using their own materials. If HOAC equipment is used e.g. buoyancy aid, paddle, masthead float it must be placed in the large black box by the log cabin after use.
  - Wet suits and cags are not available for use.
- **Safety Cover**
  - Members are required to have experience equal to or greater than RYA Level 2 and be experienced and confident of performing their activity safely in the given conditions.
  - Members are required to be able to handle their boat without assistance and to be able to recover their own boat in the event of an incident (eg capsized).
  - Emergency Safety cover is provided but in the interests of staff and members health shall only be called upon in the event of an emergency.
  - Paddles and Mast head flotation devices are recommended to aid self recovery and are available from HOAC.
  - A more **conservative** approach to operating in the given weather conditions shall apply and the Duty Officer reserves the right to close the lake.
- **Racing**
  - No organised racing will take place during Phase 1, work is underway by the race committee to prepare for Phase 2 and beyond
- **Changes**
  - As with everything to do with this virus, all plans may change significantly and at short notice. Please check the HOAC website for updates.
